



## *Music Guidelines for the Celebration of Marriage*

### *St. Francis Xavier Parish*

Music for wedding liturgies should be chosen with care and according to sound liturgical principles. Music in the Catholic Marriage Rite must express the worship of God for the mystery of love he created and transforms in this sacrament. Because of this, most popular and secular songs are not appropriate for the Catholic Marriage Rite, and therefore not acceptable.

#### **SELECTION OF MUSIC MINISTERS**

Music ministry plays a central and inherent role in Catholic worship. Liturgical musicians lead the assembly in sung prayer, assisting those gathered in their worship of God. St. Francis Xavier has several qualified musicians who are well acquainted with the liturgy and parish practices. The Director of Music will arrange musicians for the ceremony.

In some instances, wedding couples might wish to invite friends or family members to participate in the music for their wedding. This is a wonderful arrangement for the couple/family/friend, one that our parish welcomes.

Please use the following guidelines:

- If guest musicians are currently music ministers in the Catholic church, or have been trained in leading music for the Catholic liturgy, they may provide all of the music for the liturgy. Because they will need to be shown the facilities, procedures, and equipment by someone in the ministry, a fee to the assisting minister might apply.
- If guest musicians are not trained music ministers in the Catholic liturgy, it will be necessary to also contract musicians from St. Francis Xavier's music ministry to help lead the music for the liturgy. Standard musician fees will apply.

Please make advance arrangements with the music director any time a guest musician is planned and **before** contacting musicians for your wedding.

## **MUSICIAN FEES**

The fees that you pay to the church do not cover the services of musicians for the wedding liturgy. Although rates can vary, the standard fees for our musicians are:

Organist/Pianist: \$150

Cantor: \$150

One musician acting as both Cantor & Pianist: \$ 200

Instrumentalist: \$100

*\*These rates include the rehearsal and ceremony. Any additional request for the musician's time will be subject to additional fees.*

**Please note:** All contracts must be signed and payments finalized prior to the wedding date. Musicians act as independent contractors, and are under no obligation to provide music for the wedding celebration if they have not received payment beforehand.

## **SELECTION OF MUSIC**

Please use the following list of music as a resource in selecting music for the wedding.

On very limited occasions recorded music may be used in the church. These songs are subject to the liturgical discretion of the music director and may only be used at specific times during the service. All musical selections must be approved by the music director at least one month prior to the wedding liturgy.
